

**OTTAWA FORESTS AND GREENSPACE ADVISORY COMMITTEE**  
**ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2005**

**Mandate and Introduction**

The Ottawa Forests and Greenspace Advisory Committee (OFGAC) provides advice and guidance to Ottawa City Council on trees, greenspaces, open spaces and wetlands to help safeguard the environment of the city.

OFGAC provides:

- input into policies and budgets related to greenspace preservation and the management of urban and rural forests;
- recommendations to the city on how to meet its greenspace and forest-related objectives as outlined in the Official Plan and other planning documents; and
- public awareness of the role of greenspace and forests in protecting and enhancing quality of life.

Over the past year, OFGAC has worked to have its mandated provision of advice to Council on the importance of trees, forests, greenspace and wetlands lead to a new way of thinking about planning and development that will conserve these, our greatest natural assets. To fulfill this goal, OFGAC has focused its work in four areas:

**Policy and Planning Initiatives**

OFGAC has worked and will continue to work with the city on the development of the Greenspace Master Plan, a Forest Strategy, a Biodiversity Strategy, all of which are vital components of the Official Plan. These documents are intended to provide the strategic framework for the preservation of tree and forest cover to improve air quality and meet municipal Kyoto targets, and enhance the visual, social and ecological environment of the City.

OFGAC also provided input to Community Design Plans for Constance Bay, East Urban, Leitrim, Riverside South and South Nepean Town Centre. The Committee participated in the development of the Good Forestry Practices in Sensitive Natural Areas By-law and reviewed the first draft of a bylaw for the Protection and Maintenance of Trees and Forests on Municipal Properties. Members also participated in Public Consultation Groups for the N/S and E/W LRT studies. Regrettably, OFGAC advice that the existing Walkley Road Service Yard continue to be used for the N/S LRT has been ignored.

**Emerging Issues and Requested Advice Initiatives**

OFGAC provided comments on 62 development applications noting how the proposed development would impact our forests and greenspaces and advocating the use of native plant material where appropriate. The Advisory Committee provided advice to PWS (Transportation) on the draft Stormwater Management Plan and on the potential to save the nationally endangered Butternut trees, as well as Black Walnut, Red Oak and Black Cherry at the proposed Berrigan and Greenbank Transitway and Park and Ride facility.

OFGAC and the Environmental Advisory Committee researched and prepared a *Cumulative Effects of City Council Decisions on the Environment* report and met with the city's Chief Corporate Planning and Performance Officer to discuss incorporating our concerns and indicators into the *Corporate Services Community Impact Indicators*. OFGAC then participated in the review of the draft lists of Community Impact Indicators for the Ottawa 20/20 and Environment Agendas. The new indicators will be part of the City's future annual reports.

Members of the Committee provided input to the 2005 and 2006 Capital and Operating Budgets, presenting the case for increased funding in some cases and maintenance of funding for forestry and environmental management programs.

OFGAC responded to a Councillor's request to study pocket parks, or roadside parks, and this preparatory work will lead to a 2006 work plan project.

### **Outreach Initiatives**

OFGAC hosted its 2005 Fall Forum, with eight presentations by local experts, on October 1 in Kanata. With the assistance of the Tree Canada Foundation, the event was carbon-neutral. More than seven community groups sponsored the Forum, indicating our excellent relationships with local and national associations.

The website, continually updated by our volunteer webmaster, continues to provide information about Ottawa's forests and greenspaces and OFGAC's activities. In 2005, 56,000 pages were viewed by users or 620 MB of information was transferred.

Completed the Native Trees and Shrubs Database and distributed it to four peer reviewers. Their comments will be considered in the final version, which should be posted to the OFGAC website early in 2006. The database will serve as a guide to encourage the planting of native species.

Public interest in Ottawa's urban and rural forests remained high in 2005. Twenty people sent comments, requests for information or complaints about treatment of trees to the OFGAC website (the emails are forwarded to the OFGAC Chair who forwarded them to the appropriate person in the City or OFGAC for action).

A proposal for a notable (heritage) tree program is being developed and 43 submissions from the public identifying notable trees have already been received.

OFGAC established contacts with and respond to queries from the media, namely the Ottawa Citizen, Nepean This Week, Weekly Journal, Orleans Star, and gave a number of interviews on trees and development issues plus the Fall Forum. OFGAC arranged for several newspaper journalists of various local papers to cover stories on the importance of trees, a potential heritage tree program for the city, and the history of trees in Ottawa. Some headlines of the articles were: 'Let's preserve our heritage trees'; 'Ottawa's trees will finally get the recognition they deserve'; 'Lots of community events are planned for this fall'; 'City group hunts "heritage" trees'.

### **Management Initiatives**

OFGAC interviewed several candidates and recruited two new full time and five reserve members for 2006. A mentor-mentee system for new 2005 members was established in January 2005.

The Chair, Vice-chair and several members attended meetings with city staff and EAC to discuss how to improve procedures relating to the review of development applications. OFGAC also provided advice to the City Clerk's office on proposed revisions to the bylaw governing the proceedings of its Advisory Committees and also commented on revisions to the Advisory Committee Appointment Policy.

## Summary of Activities from 2005 Workplan

### A POLICY AND PLANNING

#### A1 Greenspace Master Plan

- OFGAC subcommittee provided extensive comments to staff on the GMP
- Attended the public information meetings held in June 2005

**Results/Current Status:** Work on the GMP was delayed by Council until after the Rural Summit. OFGAC will continue to work with staff on the GMP in 2006

#### A2 Promote Land Acquisition through the Municipal Act

- Two presentations to Corporate Services and Economic Development Committee recommending against the disposal and sale of four lots on Ethier St in Orleans

**Results/Current Status:** Council agreed to add these four lots to five adjacent lots, an unopened road allowance and a ravine to create a passive woodlot. Preparatory work started with the community to raise the money required to repay the development charges.

#### A3 Forest Strategy

- Reviewed and provided comments to staff on first and second drafts

**Results/Current Status:** The Strategy incorporates most of OFGAC's comments.

#### A4 Maintenance Standards for Trees and Community Forests

- No action as item is delayed by City

#### A5 Biodiversity Strategy

- No action as item is delayed by City

#### A6 Special Planning Studies

##### **A6.1 Urban Natural Areas Environmental Evaluation Study**

- Sat on Technical Advisory Committee and reviewed final draft and recommended approval of it by Council
- Presentation to Planning and Environment Committee recommending approval of Phase 1
- Recommended Phase 2 funding in Budget 2005

**Results/Current Status:** Phase 1 report accepted and Phase 2 work funded. Study map used in OFGAC display to publicise its value as a planning tool. Extensive use of the data in Phase 1 report in OFGAC development reviews.

##### **A6.2 Riverside South Community Design Plan**

- Attended meetings of the Public Advisory Committee
- Provided advice regarding the retention of trees and forests in this large development
- Reviewed Subdivision Plans, as the implementation of the CPD unfolded

- Promoted development of pathways and green/blue linkages throughout the new community
- Monitored plans for transit corridors
- Presentation to Planning and Environment Committee recommending additional greenspace retention via link corridors and with that exception, recommending approval of the overall concept plan

**Results/Current Status:** Significant forests retained in overall concept plan; additional green corridor linkages not accepted by staff and developer.

### **A6.3 Leitrim Community Design Plan**

- Attended meetings of the Public Advisory Committee
- Provided advice regarding the role of trees and forests in this large development
- Comments provided on retention of existing windbreaks, woodlots, forests, and significant trees
- Presentation to Planning and Environment Committee recommending retention of more of the provincially significant wetland

**Results/Current Status:** Recommendations for additional protection of wetlands not accepted. Development proposals being processed.

### **A6.4 Ottawa Design Study**

- Participated on advisory committee and provided comments to consultant and staff

**Results/Current Status:** Waiting for staff to provide guidelines document and schedule full public consultation.

### **A6.5 East-West Light Rail**

- Attended five meetings in 2005
- Worked to have the study Terms of Reference modified to take into account community concerns

**Results/Current Status:** Terms of Reference accepted by Ministry of Environment

### **A6.6 North-South Light Rail**

#### **Activities**

- Attended six meetings in 2005
- Promoted the preservation of greenspace and trees and an environmental perspective

**Results/Current Status:** The OFGAC recommendation that the Walkley Road service yard be used was ignored by the planners and instead a site has been chosen that is environmentally sensitive. OFGAC's concerns that the comments of the Public Consultation Group have not been provided for verification and that the minutes of a PCG meeting not prepared or distributed have not been addressed.

**A6.7 Nepean South Town Centre**

- Attended six CDP meetings in 2005, reviewed the first draft proposal from City Staff and Consultant and presented proposed plan to OFGAC
- Reviewed satellite images of the natural features and promoted the preservation of greenspace, woodlots and promoted the retention of the natural features to the extent possible
- Prepared and submitted OFGAC's response regarding the proposed Transitway route to the Project Manager responsible for the Environmental Assessment Study
- Incorporated the EAs to the South-Barrhaven sub-committee's activities

**Results/Current Status:** Report on 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Open Houses written for approval at January 2006 OFGAC meeting. City has linked Barrhaven CDP, Southwest Transitway Extension EA, Jock Subwatershed Study Phase 1, Greenbank Class EA, Nepean Town Centre, Berrigan Park and Ride and Berrigan Rapid Transit Station studies – all of which will be reviewed by OFGAC Working Groups as the years proceed.

**A7 Good Forestry Practices in Sensitive Natural Areas By-Law**

- Attended and spoke in favour of bylaw at June meeting in West Carleton with approximately 30 people and the Councillor in attendance.

**Results/Current Status:** Initiative delayed due to Rural Summit; OFGAC will press for resumption of approval process in the beginning of 2006 and continue to work with staff to pass the by-law.

**A8 Land Trust**

- Reviewed the land trust situation in Ottawa
- Presentation on Land Trusts at Museum of Biodiversity

**Results/Current Status:** OFGAC concluded the best course of action is to bring together agencies interested or involved in land conservation and preservation. In 2006 OFGAC will continue to discuss the potential for a partnership among these organizations.

**B EMERGING ISSUES AND REQUESTED ADVICE****B1 Review of Development and Zoning Change Proposals**

- Provided comments to Planning staff on 62 development applications, with particular attention paid to: impact of building placement on trees, forests, and greenspace; the adequacy and completeness of the EISs; tree protection and preservation plans; proposed tree and shrub planting plans (native vs. non-native species)
- Presented OFGAC comments to Planning and Environment Committee on four applications; noted to PEC and CSED that Advisory Committee comments were sometimes ignored and/or not referred to in staff reports
- Met with developers to review plans that proposed bisecting substantial woodlots and hedgerows
- Refined and updated OFGAC procedures for review of development applications and the template for providing comments to planning staff

- Participated with EAC in a meeting with senior staff in the PGM Department to review Advisory Committee input into staff reports in order to improve AC input to development reviews.

**Results/Current Status:** Council direction that Advisory Committee comments be included in staff reports and staff to consult ACs if comments are to be abridged. OFGAC presentations to PEC did not result in significant amendments to zoning change or Official Plan amendment proposals.

## **B2 Inventories**

### **B2.1 Heritage Trees / Notable Trees**

- Created and presented a Heritage tree display for at the Alta Vista Reforestation Project planting day and other OFGAC outreach activities
- With the Fall Forum, requested public to nominate notable trees; 43 nominations received and information posted on the OFGAC website
- Presentation on heritage trees at OFGAC Fall Forum
- Corresponded with the Ontario Heritage Tree Alliance (OHTA) on its pilot
- Re-drafted the heritage tree proposal presented to OFGAC November 2004 to incorporate data received from the OHTA project and consulted with City of Ottawa Forestry staff on this revised proposal

**Results/Current Status:** Have identified 43 local notable trees and will review results of OHTA pilot. Heritage Tree proposal redrafted and re-named and will be presented to OFGAC and other interested parties in 2006.

### **B2.2 Heritage Woodlots**

**Results/Current Status:** Will consider merger with B2.1 in 2006 as the OHTA project incorporates heritage woodlots under the heading of arboreal remnants.

### **B2.3 CityGreen - Forest Cover Evaluation**

- Advice and assistance to city staff as needed as the evaluation proceeds

**Results/Current Status:** Steering committee meeting scheduled for February 2006

## **B3 Management Plans for Community Forests/Liaison**

- Advised City during development or updating of community forest master plans
- Established network of stakeholders

### **B3.1 Torbolton Forest**

- Attended annual Spring cleanup run by Torbolton Forest Advisory Committee on May 14, sought funds to hire dumpster for refuse collected
- Assisted in the marking of rare plant communities prior to Red Pine thinning in November
- Provided ongoing policy advice on community forest

**Results/Current Status:** Councillor provided funds for dumpster; rare plant locations marked prior to thinning and so their destruction avoided.

**B3.2 Cumberland**

- No activities.

**B3.3 Marlborough**

- Attended meetings; the MFCG needs a champion to interest more people in meeting regularly to deal with ongoing issues including money for snow removal and spring cleanup

**B3.4 Carp Hills**

- Maintained OFGAC liaison and reviewed development proposals

**B4 Requested Advice**

- Pathways Project – reviewed City document and provided comments to staff
- Rural Summit – two members attended the 2-day event, and provided the OFGAC perspective on the need to preserve greenspace
- Capital Standards Review Initiative – identified six initiative of interest to OFGAC and provided comments to City staff
- Protection and maintenance of trees and forests on municipal property by-law – reviewed first draft and provided information about impact of provincial *Fences Act* on bylaw
- Mud Creek and Jock River Watershed Studies – reviewed and provided comments
- Sensitive Marine Clay and Trees Report – reviewed and commented on draft and final versions; provided comments and recommendations to PEC
- Stormwater Management Plan – reviewed and commented on draft; provided information about the Forestry Services' sensitive marine clay report to the City staff engineer responsible for the Plan

**Results/Current Status:** No further documentation received from staff; document used in OFGAC development reviews.

- Reviewed and analyzed 2005 budget documents to develop OFGAC priorities
- Attended Councillors' Ward meetings to outline OFGAC priorities

- Discussions with and emails/telephone calls to individual Councillors to promote OFGAC priorities
- Formal presentation of OFGAC priorities made at Council Committee of the Whole

**Results/Current Status:** All OFGAC priorities supported by Council except Community Forests cleanups, parking lot snow removal, and signage.

- Attended Councillors' Ward meetings to outline OFGAC priorities
- Discussions with and email/telephone calls to individual Councillors to promote OFGAC priorities
- Presentation to Committee of the Whole on OFGAC perspective on the need to maintain trees, plant new trees, maintain community forests, fund the Trees and Foundation Strategy, subwatershed planning and environmental remediation

**Results/Current Status:** All of OFGAC Capital and Operating Budget priorities funded except Advisory Committee workplan funding and authority and funds to support Community Forests cleanups and winter snow plowing etc.

- Tree planted at the Fall Forum (donated by Minto/Tree Canada) to mark carbon neutrality of the event

- Prepared notes for the OFGAC website and printed material: general information on exotic forest pests, as well as on specific current exotic pests threatening urban trees and forests in Canada – Exotic pests as threats to urban trees and forests; Asian Long-Horned Beetle (ALHB); Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) – in collaboration with OFGAC’s Outreach Subcommittee
- Liaised with City of Ottawa staff on exotic pest management protocols, contingency planning, and educational/outreach programs (ongoing)

**Results/Current Status:** Information on exotic pests is now available on the OFGAC website for general public use; city staff may make use of OFGAC professional expertise; there have been no reports of ALHB or EAB in Ottawa (yet).
